



## Guidelines for the Admission Medical Form

It is very important that we know your medical history, so that if you should fall ill at any time whilst doing your MBA at HEC Paris, we can take the best possible care of you.

Therefore, we kindly request that you fill out **pages 1 and 2** of your blue medical form and **bring it with you for your first week on campus**. This form is entirely confidential and only the school doctor will have access to it. **Please do not fill out pages 3 and 4.**

### Medical emergency form

Please fill out page 1 of your Admission Medical Form with your intake year, program, name and emergency contact. Please ensure you have signed the bottom of the page.

### Medical background

On **page 2** of the medical form, we ask your doctor to notify us of your medical history, allergies, and any medication you need; for example we need to know if you have diabetes, epilepsy, or are allergic to a drug such as penicillin. We understand that this might not always be possible, especially if your doctor does not speak English or you are living away from your family doctor. In this case you may exceptionally fill out page 2 of the form yourself, but a doctor must sign, date and stamp the bottom of the page.

### Vaccinations

Different countries have different regulations as to which vaccinations are mandatory. Currently in France you do not need proof of any vaccinations when you enter the country, but the diphtheria/tetanus/polio vaccine is obligatory when you live here. We strongly recommend that you are up to date with the vaccinations listed before you start your MBA, and we encourage you to check your medical history and which vaccinations you have received. Once you have arrived on campus, we will also inform you about the vaccination requirements issued by the OFII (Office Français de l'Immigration et de l'Intégration) that you'll need when renewing your visa.

### Certificate clearing student to practice competitive sport

It is the law in France that before taking part in any competitive sport (such as a football tournament or a marathon) you must have a doctor check your health for insurance purposes. We also need this form so that you can use our gym and sports fields on campus. Please have your doctor sign the form to say that you are in good health to play sports before you arrive. Again, if your doctor does not speak English you can fill it out yourself but it must be signed, dated and stamped by a certified doctor.
